### **Women in History**

Tye Leung Schulze (August 24, 1887 – March 10, 1972) became the first Chinese American woman to vote in the United States when she cast a ballot in San Francisco on May 19, 1912. She also became the first Chinese American woman to pass the civil service exams and to occupy a government job.

The San Francisco Call stated that she was "the first Chinese woman in the history of the world to exercise the electoral franchise." Schulze was also the first Chinese woman hired to work at Angel Island. She is a designated Women's History Month Honoree by the National Women's History Project.

"She repeatedly defied the limitations imposed on her, transcending barriers, achieving a self-created life of honor, dignity, and service. No national organization or major legislation bears her name. Her legacy is one of determined belief in human worth, in a kinship that transcends artificial borders, in the steady, dedicated assault on prejudice and bigotry." – Robin Kadison Berson

# 2022 Tech Trek Campers Announced by Linda Flores

To refresh your memory, 2019 was the last year that our branch sent girls to Tech Trek, the STEM camp started by AAUW, which is held on various college campuses each summer. We were just a couple of weeks away from interviews in 2020, when the camps were canceled due to COVID. Last year, Tech Trek was strictly 'virtual,' and our team opted out of participating. This is the first time in three years that we have been able to send girls, and we are thrilled!

Our selection process began a couple of months ago, with Jacobsen Middle School teachers nominating several outstanding seventh grade girls for consideration. The girls were then required to submit an application, as well as an essay on a designated subject. This year's topic was how the girls would use math and/or science to make the world a better place. Face-to-face interviews with our local Tech Trek team were held in April.

The following girls have been selected to attend Tech Trek this summer: Kennedi Clark, Aliya Meza, Gianna Moreno, and Isabella Nunez. All of the girls came highly recommended by their science teachers, and each brings with them their own unique strengths and talents. They will be attending one of two Tech Trek camps held at Santa Barbara in July.

The girls will be introduced at our annual branch meeting on Saturday, May 14th. We will also be recognizing our corporate and individual sponsors (from 2020,) whose donations have been banked until this year.
